- First report delivered (4th of October)
 - survey
- Second report 7th of March 2022
 - stakeholder's dialogue during October

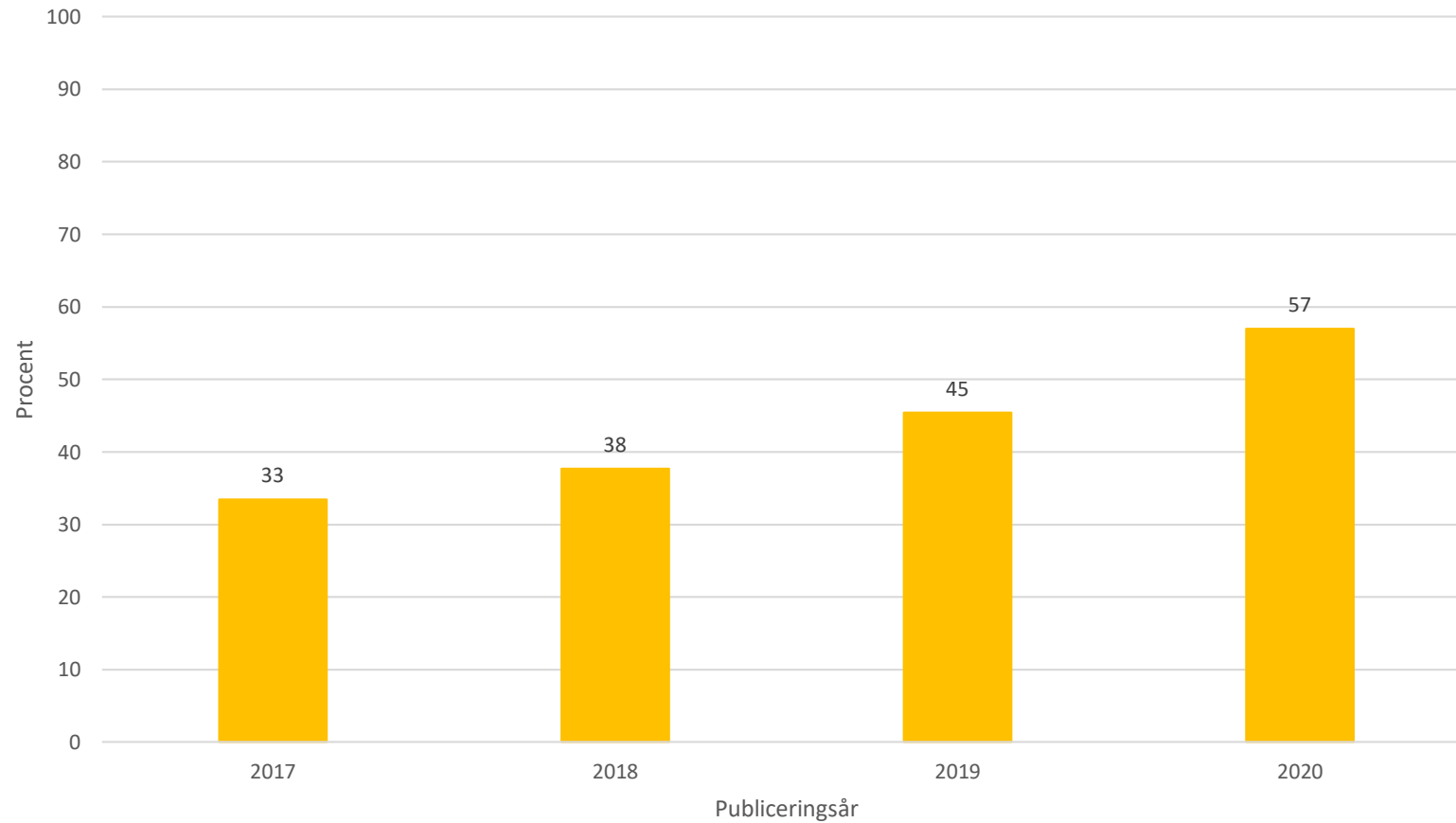

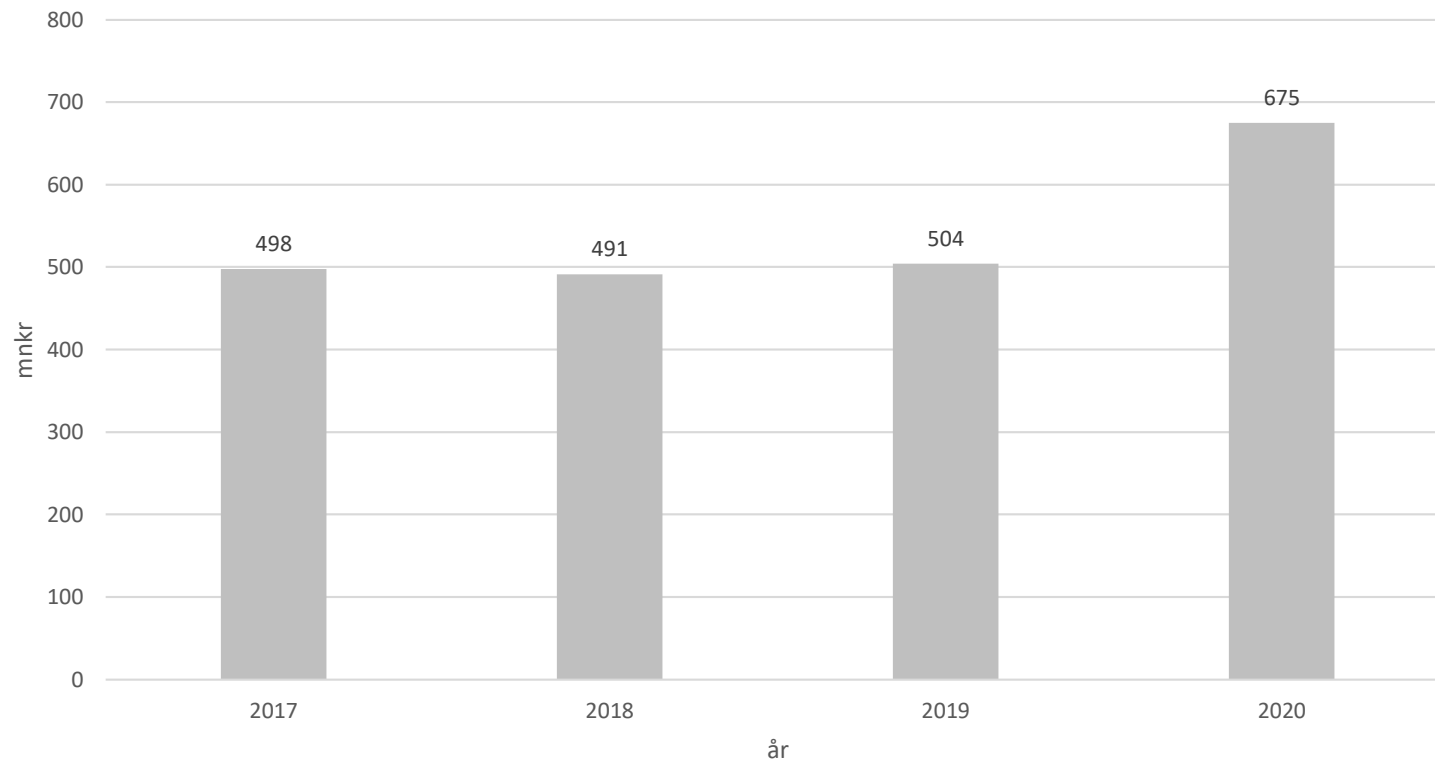
Current statistics 1 - Swepub



Immediate OA (gold + hybrid)



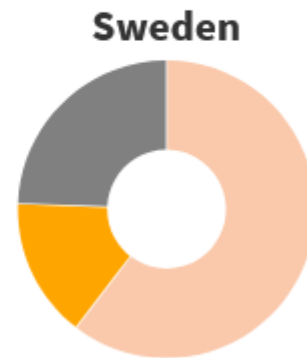
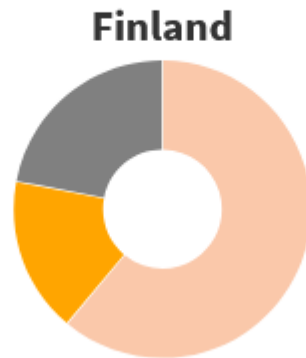
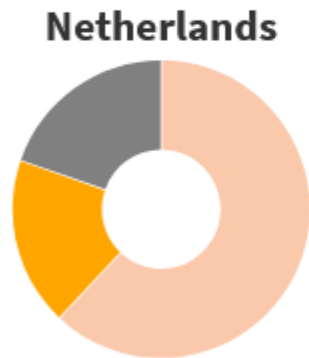
Total cost of scholarly publishing
