## OA updates

- <u>Danish Open Access network</u> is a new national network consists of employees from Danish educational institutions who deal with the dissemination as well as operational and developmental issues in relation to Open Access. The purpose of the Network is to be a forum for knowledge sharing and discussion on practical issues and challenges that the institutions are faced with in their daily work with Open Access. The Network is organized independent of stakeholder organizations and projects/funding.
- Open Access week 2022 <a href="https://openaccess.dk/oaw2022">https://openaccess.dk/oaw2022</a>. For the first time there is organized a national coordinated contribution to the annual international Open Access Week. See programme <a href="here">here</a>.
- Denmark's National Strategy for Open Access expires this year and will be revised/updated after an evaluation process. The Danish Agency for Science and Higher Education, which is behind the strategy, has not involved the university libraries in the evaluation of the strategy. The strategy's goal is 100 % Open Access to all peer reviewed scientific articles (incl. proceedings with ISSN) from Danish research institutions in the year 2025. In the current year, the percentage has reached 62.71%.
- New national data repository to be established and launched in 2023 based on Dataverse. Open for all research institutions in Denmark. University of Copenhagen and Copenhagen University Library will implement and operate the repository.

## OS updates

- <u>A National implementation</u> for the new <u>National data management strategy based on the FAIR principles</u> DeiC coordinates the work on behalf of the The Danish Agency for Education and Research with a reference group with responsibility for national coordination and working groups to follow up on specific themes related to the strategy

 DeiC has decided on a new national trusted digital repository (TDR). The University of Copenhagen is to implement and operate a new national repository called <u>DeiC Dataverse</u>, which gives all researchers in Denmark access to a secure option to publish and archive their research data.
