

Finnish Ontology Service

Briefly in English

ONKI is a joint project between the National Library of Finland, the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Education and Culture. The key aims of the project are

- to build a national-level centralized ontology service Finto including
 - o a platform for the publication of ontologies
 - o tools for utilizing the ontologies (search, browsing, APIs, etc.)
 - o instructions and information about the service and the utilization of ontologies
- to develop and maintain the Finnish General Upper Ontology YSO
 - o adding and updating concepts (currently over 26,000 concepts)
 - o providing terms in three languages (Finnish, Swedish, English)
 - o the ontology is based upon the General Finnish Thesaurus YSA
- to coordinate and support ontology maintenance on a national level
 - o offering and developing support, tools, and processes for special domain ontologies (health, botany, linguistics, etc.) maintained by domain organizations
 - o maintenance of KOKO ontology (currently over 45,000 concepts), which connects special domain ontologies to YSO
 - technical maintenance of two public administration ontologies, JUHO (ministries), and JUPO (public services)

Further goals for ONKI project include

- mapping YSO to international resources LCSH and Freebase
- national-level co-operation with public administration, cultural memory organizations, and the media sector, especially with their metadata and open data related projects
